Beating COVID-19: Together in Hope

Yesterday, Matt Hancock, Secretary of State for Health and Social Care, announced that a further two weeks of restrictions would apply to Leicester and the Borough of Oadby and Wigston. Whilst there was some easing of the strict lockdown measures applied from the 29 June, the message is clear: the number of cases remains too high for a relaxation of measures to bring them in line with most other parts of the country.

This news was hugely disappointing and has particular impact on those who live in the area affected, but it is also a reminder of the challenge we face and the continued threat of COVID-19.

Over the past two weeks we have worked with Leicester City Council and Public Health England to intensify support and efforts to bring the number of cases down. Many NHS colleagues have given their time to volunteer and support a programme of mass community testing in affected areas. We have also played a key role in raising awareness of how people can protect themselves and others, local GPs have for example produced videos in different languages to help reach all communities. Although progress may appear slow, we are getting results and cases of COVID are falling. It is likely that other areas of the country will face lockdowns and they will look Leicester's experience to help them.

While we continue to treat people with COVID-19 in Leicester's Hospitals, there has been a small decline in the

number of admissions and those needing intensive care support over the last few days and colleagues continue to provide support to patients with COVID-19 as well as those needing urgent and emergency care. Admissions in community hospitals also continue to be low. Across the NHS we are all working hard to help restore services for our patients where it is safe to do so.
